



The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health plan. The SBC shows you how you and the plan would share the cost for covered health care services. NOTE: Information about the cost of this plan (called the premium) will be provided separately.

Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall <u>deductible</u> ?	\$2,500/single	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from providers up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> ?	Yes. Certain <u>preventive care</u> is covered and paid by the <u>plan</u> before you meet your <u>deductible</u> .	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost-sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . Are there other <u>deductibles</u> for specific services?	Yes, \$250/single for covered brand name drugs, including specialty drugs	You must pay all of the costs for these services up to the specific <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay for these services..
What is the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> for this <u>plan</u> ?	\$6,500/single	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met.
What is not included in the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> ?	Emergency Room and <u>Urgent Care</u> copays, <u>premiums</u> , balance-billed charges and health care this <u>plan</u> does not cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> .
Will you pay less if you use a <u>network provider</u> ?	Not applicable	This <u>plan</u> does not use a <u>provider network</u> . You can receive covered services from any <u>provider</u> .
Do you need a <u>referral</u> to see a <u>specialist</u> ?	No	You can see the <u>specialist</u> you choose without a <u>referral</u> .



All **coinsurance** costs shown in this chart are after your **deductible** has been met, if a **deductible** applies. Services with **copayments** are covered before you meet your **deductible**, unless otherwise specified.

If you are pregnant	Office visits	No Charge	<u>Cost sharing</u> does not apply to certain <u>preventive services</u> . Your Rights to Continue Coverage: If you lose coverage under the plan, then, depending upon the circumstances, Federal and State laws may provide protections that allow you to keep health coverage. Any such rights may be limited in duration and will require you to pay a **premium**, which may be significantly higher than the premium you pay while covered under the plan. Other limitations on your rights to continue coverage may also apply.

Your Grievance and Appeals Rights: There are agencies that can help if you have a complaint against your plan for a denial of a claim. This complaint is called a grievance or appeal. Your plan documents also provide complete information to submit a claim, appeal, or a grievance for any reason to your plan. Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes.

If you don't have Minimum Essential Coverage for a month, you'll have to make a payment when you file your tax return unless you qualify for an exemption from the requirement that you have health coverage for that month.

Does this plan meet Minimum Value Standards? Yes.

If your plan doesn't meet the Minimum Value Standards, you may be eligible for a premium tax credit to help you pay for a plan through the Marketplace.

About these Coverage Examples:



This is not a cost estimator. Treatments shown are just examples of how this plan might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your providers charge, and many other factors. Focus on the cost sharing amounts (deductibles, copayments and coinsurance) and excluded services under the plan. Use this information to compare the portion of costs you might pay under different health plans. Please note these coverage examples are based on self-only coverage.

Peg is having a baby

(9 months of in-network pre-natal care and a hospital delivery)

- **The plan's overall deductible** \$2,500
- **Specialist coinsurance** 20%
- **Hospital (facility) coinsurance** 20%
- **Other coinsurance** 20%

This EXAMPLE event includes services like:

Specialist office visits (*prenatal care*)
 Childbirth/Delivery Professional Services
 Childbirth/Delivery Facility Services
 Diagnostic tests (*ultrasounds and blood work*)
 Specialist visit (*anesthesia*)

Total Example Cost	\$12,800
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In this example, Peg would pay:

<i>Cost Sharing</i>	
Deductibles*	\$2,500
Copayments	\$10
Coinsurance	\$2,000

<i>What isn't covered</i>	
Limits or exclusions	\$60

The total Peg would pay is	\$4,570
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Managing Joe's type 2 Diabetes

(a year of routine in-network care of a well-controlled condition)

- **The plan's overall deductible** \$2,500
- **Specialist coinsurance** 20%
- **Hospital (facility) coinsurance** 20%
- **Other coinsurance** 20%

This EXAMPLE event includes services like:

Primary care physician office visits (*including disease education*)
 Diagnostic tests (*blood work*)
 Prescription drugs
 Durable medical equipment (*glucose meter*)

Total Example Cost	\$7,400
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In this example, Joe would pay:

<i>Cost Sharing</i>	
Deductibles*	\$2,500
Copayments	\$300
Coinsurance	\$10

<i>What isn't covered</i>	
Limits or exclusions	\$60

The total Joe would pay is	\$2,870
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Mia's Simple Fracture

(in-network emergency room visit and follow up care)

- **The plan's overall deductible** \$2,500
- **Specialist coinsurance** 20%
- **Hospital (facility) coinsurance** 20%
- **Other coinsurance** 20%

This EXAMPLE event includes services like:

Emergency room care (*including medical supplies*)
 Diagnostic test (*x-ray*)
 Durable medical equipment (*crutches*)
 Rehabilitation services (*physical therapy*)

Total Example Cost	\$1,900
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In this example, Mia would pay:

<i>Cost Sharing</i>	
Deductibles*	\$1,500
Copayments	\$200
Coinsurance	\$50

<i>What isn't covered</i>	
Limits or exclusions	\$0

The total Mia would pay is	\$1,750
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Note: These numbers assume the patient does not participate in the plan's wellness program.
